Equipment (rentals, purchase & local vendors)

16. Cumberland County Conservation District — Local conservation programs, technical support, and staff who can advise on equipment needs and conservation practices. Office: 310 Allen Road, Suite 301, Carlisle, PA 17013. Phone: 717-240-7812; email listed on site. Some nearby conservation districts and regional partners operate no-till drill and equipment rental programs — if you need a specific rental (drills, tillers, forklifts, etc.), the Conservation District can advise on local availability and partner programs.

17. Local equipment dealers & rental services (Mechanicsburg / Carlisle area) — For immediate short-term equipment needs (forklifts, skid steers, tent/pavilion rentals, pallet jacks, small engines): examples include Equipment Depot (Mechanicsburg), Groff Tractor (Mechanicsburg), and regional rental suppliers; contact locally for rates and availability. (These are private vendors — useful when Conservation District rentals aren't available.)

Regional Conservation District rentals / neighboring county programs — Many PA county conservation districts maintain no-till drill and other equipment rental programs (fees per acre/day); if Cumberland doesn't have a specific unit available when you need it, neighboring county districts often do. Check with your Conservation District for referrals.

Technical assistance & funding (grants / loans / program support)

19. USDA — Carlisle Service Center (FSA / NRCS / Rural Development contacts) — Federal point of contact for farm loans, disaster assistance, conservation program sign-ups (EQIP, CSP), and technical conservation planning. 20. PA Department of Agriculture — Grants & Resilient Food Systems Programs — State grant programs that help with marketing projects, equipment purchases, and food-system infrastructure (e.g., Resilient Food Systems Infrastructure program / Simplified Equipment grants; PA Specialty Crop Block Grant Program for marketing/research). Application windows vary by year — check PDA announcements for current deadlines. (Recent SCBGP deadlines have varied; USDA AMS FY2025 RFA listed July 7, 2025 as the federal submission deadline.)

PA Farm Vitality & other PDA small grant programs — PDA and associated state programs periodically run small planning grants (business planning, diversification) and equipment simplification grants — often on a rolling or funds-available basis. Check the PDA grants page and local Extension for application help and deadlines.

Pennsylvania SBDC / Local economic development — Assistance with grant applications, business planning, and financial projections for equipment/marketing/food-safety upgrades; local SBDC or county economic development offices can help prepare applications and budgets. Contact the PA SBDC network or the SBDC office nearest you (Shippensburg/central PA options).

23. Pennsylvania Agricultural Surplus System (PASS) — Coordinates donation of surplus food (including helping use unused field space that can be planted with food to donate, surplus at harvest time, and value-added projects) to food banks and reimbursement to farmers.
